- The Institute for Urban Teacher Education
 - Mary provided updates on the status of the Institute including the goals, governance structure, timeline for approval and implementation, and implications for students.
- TEAC Accreditation Visit
 - Due to the restructuring of the Department of Teaching and Learning the TEAC audit has been postponed until Fall 2010 with a formal decision in December, 2010
- Course Curriculum Changes
 - Only small changes to titles, etc.
- Secondary 4-Year Program Updates Outline of existing 4-year programs shared; special thanks to Sharon Adams and departmental advisors.
 - Beth Krensky explained the changes to the Art Teaching program
- Six Semester Planning Guide
 - Sharon Adams explained the new planning guide that will outline student academic planning guides.
- Interdisciplinary Efforts to Infuse Diversity across Teacher Education and accompanying content-based methods courses beginning fall 2009.
 - Mary discussed several possible options for Diversity infusion across disciplines including case study examinations. The Department of Mathematics is the first content area outside of the College of Education to participate in these discussions for curriculum examinations.
